INTRODUCTION TO TEACHING

We are honoured to have received a QUB Teaching Award for our Introduction to Teaching programme in May 2024. This programme was developed to support new teaching assistants and lab demonstrators who lacked formal training and were looking to improve their teaching skills. It aims to elevate teaching practices among new and diverse higher education educators.

Featuring a flipped classroom approach, the programme combines selfdirected learning via Canvas with dynamic in-person sessions, concluding in a peer reviewed micro-teaching exercise that allows participants to apply their knowledge from the programme.

Participants will gain an insight to various teaching methodologies, current learning challenges, curriculum design principles, and the role of assessment and feedback. This programme is a verified route for the Future Ready Award and will run in Semester Two.





CHARTERED MANAGEMENT INSTITUTE

The Graduate School, in partnership with the Chartered Management Institute (CMI), offers you a unique opportunity to gain a Level 7 Certificate in Strategic Management and Leadership Practice.
