Dr Claire
Donnelly
University of Cambridge
Physics

Claire's research aims to improve the efficiency of current data storage facilities that currently have high carbon costs. Claire is using a significant portion of the grant to purchase equipment that will take her research to the next level.



Dr Jennifer Garden University of Edinburgh Chemistry

Jennifer's research aims to find sustainable alternatives for conventional polymers to tackle the growing environmental implications of single-use plastics. This grant is enabling Jennifer to fund chemical analysis to aid her research.



Dr Sepideh Khodaparasty Imperial College London Mechanical Engineering

Sepideh is researching chemical-free solutions to Antimicrobial Resistance, the most life-threatening consequence of the misuse and over-use of antibiotics. The grant allows Sepideh to expand her collaborations with the Natural History Museum.



Dr Katarzyna Kowal University of Cambridge *Mathematics*

Katarzyna's research is focused on applying mathematics to the fluid mechanics of glacial ice sheets to understand the dynamical controls of their stability. Katarzyna is using the grant for both laboratory equipment and to supervise two students.



Dr Margherita Yayoi Turco University of Cambridge Biological Sciences

Margherita's research goal is to understand how the endometrium supports the development of the early placenta, to help understand the cause of pre-eclampsia and other great obstetrical syndromes. The grant is funding Margherita's experiments that are crucial to her research.
